

Intended audience

The intended audience for this module are those who will help learners of all ages to become comfortable with using a smart phone to communicate.

Most of the content in this module is based on Android based smartphones. Other phones will have slightly different screens but the approach will be the same.



Phones help us to stay in touch

Everyone seems to have a smartphone these days. That is not surprising. Smartphones are useful for making calls and staying in touch wherever you are.

But does someone you know feel nervous and unsure about making a call using a smartphone? If so, this module is for you. It provides a step by step guide for those who wish to learn themselves or help others to make calls on a smartphone.

The phone types used for making and receiving phone calls have changed a lot in recent years moving from traditional landline phones to cordless phones and now more commonly to smart mobile phones.

First of all, it is important to recognise that there are some subtle but important differences between making a call using a traditional landline phone compared to using a cordless phone or a smart phone. These differences are not intuitive for all users.

The steps for making a call with a landline, cordless and smartphone are outlined in the next slides and where there are differences these are highlighted for clarity.



Receiving a call with a landline phone

The picture opposite shows a person using a typical landline phone.

Receiving a call with a landline phone involves these steps:

- the user lifts the receiver from the cradle to answer the call and start chatting to the caller
- 2. the user can end the call at any time by replacing the receiver on the cradle



Receiving a call with a cordless phone

The picture opposite shows the handset of a typical domestic cordless phone.

When receiving a call with a cordless phone the steps involved are:

- the user lifts the handset
- the user **MUST** press the green button on the handset to answer the call and start chatting to the caller
- 3. the user can end the call at any time by pressing the red button on the handset



Receiving a call with a smartphone

The picture opposite shows a smartphone.

Receiving a calls using a smart phone is very similar to a receiving a call using a cordless phone.

The details of receiving a call with a smart phone will be descriped in the next chapter of this module.

First for comparison, let us quickly review the steps involved with making calls on other types of phones.




Making a call with a landline phone

The picture opposite shows a typical landline phone.

When making a call with a landline phone the steps involved are:

- 1. the user lifts the receiver and waits to hear a dial tone
- 2. the user uses the keypad to enter the number to call the user will hear the numbers being dialled as they enter them
- 3. the user then waits for the **ring tone** or an **engaged tone**
- **4. engaged tone**: if the user hears an engaged tone (s)he should hang up and may try again later



Making a call with a landline phone (continued)

- ring tone: if the user hears a ring tone they wait until either someone answers the call or the phone rings out
- 2. if the phone rings out and the user is not prompted to leave a voice message (s)he should hang up and may try again later
- 3. if there is no answer and the recipient has a voice mail set up the user will be prompted to record a message
- 4. if the user wishes to record a message they may do so and then hang up
- if the user does not wish to record a message they should just hang up



Making a call with a cordless phone

The picture opposite shows the handset of a typical domestic cordless or phone.

When making a call with a cordless phone the steps involved are:

- 1. the user lifts the handset
- 2. the user then uses the keypad to enter the number to call
- the user MUST press the green button to activate the phone to dial the number
- 4. steps 3 to 9 are the same as those for a landline noting that the user can end the call and hang up at any time by pressing the red button on the phone





Making a call with a cordless phone (continued)

The main **difference** between making a call with a cordless phone compared to making one with a landline is that when the user lifts the handset and uses the keypad to enter the number to call the user **must** press the green call button to actually activate the phone to dial the number they have just entered.





Making a call with a smartphone

The picture opposite shows a smartphone. In SMART module 1 you learnt about some of the icons and images you may tap, touch and slide on the smartphone.. Now we will put that knowledge to good use for making calls with a smartphone.

We have seen that making calls using a smart phone is similar to a making call using a cordless phone. The next chapter will show you how to make a call with an Android smart phone.




Taking a call on a smartphone

One of the key uses of a smartphone is of course to receive calls.

This topic covers the basics of receiving calls using a smartphone.

This is an activity that can be carried out with cooperation from friends and family.



Two ways of taking calls

Actually, depending on whether your phone is locked or unlocked, there are two different ways that an incoming call will appear on your phone.

We will look at both cases.

Incoming call when the phone is locked

If the phone screen is locked, then the call will come up on the screen with the name of the caller. Two buttons will appear on the screen a green and a red button.



Rejecting a call when the phone has been locked

To reject a call in this case you touch the red phone button and slide it up the screen.

You can see that this call is from an unknown caller. It is worth checking this before you decide to answer.



Accepting a call when the phone has been locked

To take the call, you just touch the green phone button and slide it up the screen.

Incoming call when the phone is in use

If you are using the phone and/or the screen is not locked and there is an incoming call, then a small window will appear at the top of the screen with a red and a green button.



Rejecting call when the phone is in use

To reject a call you tap the red phone button

Accepting a call when the phone is in use


To accept the call you tap the green button.

In this case, the user is deciding to accept a call from an unknown number.

Making a call on a smartphone


Another key operation is making a phone call.

Again – it helps if you can work through this task by calling a friend or family member.




Using the phone app to make a call

To make a call tap on the green phone icon that is on your home screen in Android..



Screen for making calls

You have now entered the phone app screen for making phone calls.


At the bottom half of the screen is a keypad for entering a phone number. The top half of the screen displays recent calls.



Making a call by typing in a phone number

From here you can make a call in a few different ways.

The more familiar way is to type in the person's phone number and then tap the green button (with the phone icon on it) to make the call.



Making a call by selecting a contact from the calls list

The second way to make a call is to tap on a contact from the list of recently used numbers that are at the top of the screen.

The app will now make a call to that contact.

Finding and returning missed calls

Sometimes you may miss a call or not reach the phone in time and the person who is calling has hung up.

Smartphones are designed to make it relatively easy for you to see who was calling you and to enable you to call them back.






Opening the phone app to find a missed call

To find a call that you've missed you tap the green icon to enter into the phone app.



Finding a missed call

Again you see a list of phone calls in order where the top most call is the most recent call received by the phone. If a call was missed, and you didn't pick up the call all usually the details of the phone call are highlighted in red.



Returning a missed call

To return the call that was missed you tap on that call that is highlighted in red

The app will commence a call to that person.







How to make and receive IP-based calls

In this chapter, you will learn about the concept of an IP based call. The instructions will guide you on how to use IP-based applications to call family and friends, as well as clients, workmen and suppliers. At the end of the chapter, you will have a chance to practice your learning and apply it to a real-life context.

The internet has made it easier to communicate with other people. We can use it to send text messages, make voice calls or video calls with family, friends and business contacts.

Different applications can support communication by using the internet. This is done using the Internet Protocol (IP) address, an "Internet phone number" that is assigned to each device connected to the Internet.

There are different applications you can use to make an IP-based call. For this tutorial, we will focus on the 'WhatsApp' one.





WhatsApp Messenger

WhatsApp Messenger is an application that allows users to send text and voice messages, make voice and video calls and share images and documents.

This application runs on mobile devices but is also accessible from computers. The service requires the device to be connected to the internet.

WhatsApp Messenger will be covered in more detail in Module 3 chapter 4.







Search for WhatsApp on your application store

To start using WhatsApp, if it is not already installed, you need to download and install the application on your mobile device. To start this process, open the Google Play store on your phone.



Search for WhatsApp

Now search for WhatsApp messenger using the search bar.



Install and open WhatsApp


Tap on "Install". Wait for the app to install and then tap on "Open".



Agree to the Terms of Service

You will see WhatsApp's welcome page and have a chance to read the Privacy Policy and the Terms of Service. Tap on "Agree and continue".





Add your phone number

You now need to add your phone number to WhatsApp so people can find you on it.



Add your name and photo

The next step is to add your name and photo (if you wish to have one on it). Your profile details will allow people to recognize you.





Start using WhatsApp

Great job! You are now ready to use WhatsApp for voice and video calls.




Making a call using WhatsApp


To make a call using WhatsApp, tap on the tab at the top of the screen named "Calls" and tap on the phone icon with a green background.



Choose the contact and the type of call

WhatsApp will show a list of contacts saved on your phone. These people also use WhatsApp, so you can call them. If you want to make a voice call, tap on the phone icon beside the name of the person. If you want to make a video call, tap on the camera icon.





Wait for your contact to answer

If you are making a voice call, bring the phone close to your ear and wait for the contact to answer. If you are making a video call, keep looking at the screen until your contact answers. If you want to hang up the call at any time, tap on the red phone icon.



Answering a call on WhatsApp

If you receive a call on WhatsApp, you will see the photo (if the caller has set one up for their profile) and the name of the contact who is calling you. Swipe up the green phone icon to accept the call. Swipe up the red phone icon to cancel/reject the call.








Contacts list

With a traditional "landline" phone, you make a call by dialling in the phone number on the phone handset.

In chapter two we saw how you can make a phone call that way on a smart phone too. But you can also make a call on a smart phone by using the contacts list stored on the smart phone.

A contacts list allows you to store the name, number and other details of users you communicate with regularly. If you wish to call anyone in the contacts list, you can simply select their name from the contacts list and call them.






Opening the contacts List

To open the contacts list just tap on the "Contacts" icon. In the image here it is shown as an orange icon with a picture of an outline of a person's bust on it but it may be a different icon on another smartphone.







A contact list

Here is what a contacts list looks like when you have clicked on the 'contacts' icon shown in the last slide.








What the contacts list contains

The contacts list has a list of your contacts' names and their profile picture if they have set that up.




How to open a contact from the list

If you tap once on a name in the list, you can open that contact's details.







A single contact's detail

The contact screen shows the name and details of the contact. Here you can see the surname and first name and phone number.


This screen also enables you to call the person by touching the green handset button. Or you can leave this screen by tapping the 'X'.


Challenge: Adding a contact

You can add a contact to the contacts list by clicking on the '+' sign and then entering the name, number and other details of the contact you wish to add.

Let's add in the number for Emergency Services in Ireland, 112

- 1. First tap the contacts icon.
- 2. Now click '+' to create a new contact in your contacts list.
- 3. Add in the name and phone number of the contact. In this case we will leave the first name box blank
- 4. In the surname box add in **Emergency Services**
- 5. Now in the number box add in 112.



Sharing a contact

Smartphones can store a large number of contacts in the contact list.

Sometimes you may wish to share the contact details stored in your contact list with another contact of yours.

The steps to do this are shown in the next slide.





Steps for sharing a contact



Select the contact that you wish to share

- 1. Open the contact list and find the contact that you want to share
- 2. Tap the three dots ...

Steps for sharing a contact



Select how to share and the recipient of contact

Select "share" from the menu

Choose who you wish to share the contact with

Choose how you wish to share it e.g. to send it as a message tap text

Steps for sharing a contact



Send the contact

Tap the green button to send the contact
